Her arrangement of *Quem pastores laudavere* appeared on New York Polyphony's 2014 Grammy-nominated album, *Sing Thee Nowell*. Her work for mezzo soprano and piano, *Little Black Book*, was premiered at Carnegie Hall in October 2019. Susan, her husband Cameron, and their son Elliott reside in Springfield, Missouri, where Susan works as Editor of Walton Music, Cameron is the Director of Choral Studies at Missouri State University, and Elliott is a celebrity among the neighborhood dogs.

Faith Zimmer graduated from Missouri State University in 2019 with a Bachelor of Music in Music Composition and in 2021 with a graduate certificate in choral studies. During her time at MSU, Faith was a member of the Chorale, Chamber Choir, and Multicultural Ensemble. With these ensembles Faith has performed, often as a soloist, across North America, Africa, Europe, and Asia. Much of Faith's compositional influence comes from studying composition and arranging with renowned composer and arranger, Alice Parker, as a Melodious Accord Fellow. Faith's choral works are published at Walton Musc and are widely performed and recorded.
